



INTERNAL REGULATIONS

These regulations are not intended to be a complete set of rules, but rather a necessary supplement to the Residence Contract, which each guest should read carefully.

1) ENVIRONMENT (supplementing Title III - Chapter I of the Residence Contract)

a) **VEGETATION:** It is forbidden to tamper with the vegetation in any way, to hang up hammocks or clothes lines, to fix or hang objects of any other kind or to attach electrical cables to the vegetation. Our personnel is authorised to detach immediately and without notice anything at all attached to the trees in violation of these regulations. We suggest that guests bring portable clothes-racks or use stakes to attach clothes lines or other items. If vegetation is cut down or removed, the person responsible will be expelled from the campsite, without prejudice to compensation for damages and other legal measures.

b) **MAINTENANCE OF THE PITCH:** Guests must keep the pitch clean and in good order; it is not permitted to dig holes and, should this become necessary due to exceptional and imperative weather conditions, once such an event is over the terrain must be immediately restored to its original state.

c) **WASTE WATER AND WASHING WATER:** For obvious ecological reasons it is forbidden to pour out waste water, water with detergents and water used for washing vehicles (even partially).

d) **WASTE DISPOSAL:** It is forbidden to dispose of wastewater of any type or provenance except in the specifically indicated user points located inside the resort (obligatory procedure for the discharge of caravan and camper wastewater) and/or in the sanitary facilities.

e) **WASTE SEPARATION:** Special bags will be handed out for each type of waste. After use, close these carefully to avoid spillage and put them by the side of the road in front of your pitch or accommodation in the morning not later than 9:00 am. They will then be picked up by a special vehicle.

2) SOUND DIFFUSION (supplementing Title III - Chapter I of the Residence Contract)

It is forbidden, at any time of the day or night, to use musical instruments, radios, televisions, computers, CD or DVD players or cassette players without the use of suitable earphones. It is also forbidden to display radio or TV antennas of any kind.

3) TRANQUILLITY AND PUBLIC PEACE (supplementing Title III - Chapter I of the Residence Contract)

It is forbidden to behave in a noisy manner or in any manner that disturbs the peace and quiet which is required 24 hours a day. The areas involved in entertainment may follow different time schedules for events organised for the guests, without this being cause for complaints.

4) FIRE (supplementing Title III - Chapter I of the Residence Contract)

It is forbidden by law to light open fires in the woods or at a distance of less than 300 metres from these. It is therefore forbidden to light fires or use wood or charcoal stoves in the pitches or on the beach. Violation of this rule is a criminal offence. The use of the resort's special masonry barbecues is permitted on windless days and in accordance with the instructions displayed on site, with particular emphasis on never leaving the fire unattended and on the prohibition to use inflammable liquids, paper, pine cones or dry branches to light the fire, that is means that produce flames of an inconsistent nature and could generate sparks. The use of gas stoves is permitted in the pitch as long as they are set up not less than one metre from the vegetation. Smoking is forbidden in the "buffer zone", that is in the wooded area between the sea and the campsite pitches. It is forbidden to tamper with, or to use for purposes other than fire-fighting, the tools specifically provided for this purpose, such as shovels, hydrants and extinguishers. Guests are requested to extinguish matches and cigarettes with care. Violation of the above rules, which in any case constitutes a serious risk to people and things, leads to expulsion from the resort in addition to any applicable legal penalties.

5) WATER

We ask our guests behave responsibly and avoid waste or improper use, for example leaving taps open.

6) ELECTRICITY (supplementing Title III - Chapter I of the Residence Contract)

Generally 220 volt, 3 Amp, except for the supply to Category A pitches and some Category B pitches. For reasons of safety, accident prevention and fire prevention, it is forbidden to lay power cables across the roads or place cables on trees or plants. Resort personnel are explicitly authorised by the signatory of the Residence Contract to immediately and without notice detach any cables laid down in violation of this article or which have connections or plugs that are not compliant with EEC regulations.

7) CIRCULATION OF CARS, MOTORBIKES AND OTHER VEHICLES (supplementing Title III - Chapter II of the Residence Contract)

The circulation of vehicles is limited to one operation for unloading on arrival and one for loading on departure, neither of these exceeding two hours. These activities are forbidden in the hours from 1:00 pm to 3:00 pm and from 11:00 pm to 7:00 am. Circulation with electric vehicles as substitutes for bicycles is not permitted in the resort. Campers, which are admitted if equipped with a fire extinguisher, are nevertheless subject to the circulation restrictions for the discharge of chemical WCs and for exit from and return to the camping resort (by 12:45 pm and by 10:45 pm) for excursions. Speed limit for all vehicles, bicycles, cars and campers: 4 km/h, that is walking pace. The Resort Management reserves the right to confiscate any bicycles being ridden by minors at a speed greater than walking pace (the main cause of accidents involving people in the resort), in which case the bicycle will be handed over to the adult responsible for the minor. Bicycles are not allowed in the playground. Service vehicles may circulate freely at any time of the day or night. Motorbikes and/or motor scooters are not allowed inside the resort.

8) CAR PARKS (supplementing Title III - Chapter II of the Residence Contract)

These are separate from the camping resort, monitored but not attended, available free of charge to the guests.

9) PETS (supplementing Title III - Chapter I of the Residence Contract)

1. Pets are not allowed to enter the areas of the resort reserved to accommodation, supermarket and playground. 2. Pets are allowed within the resort, either belonging to our guests, their friends and/or visitors, only in the restaurant/bar Mare, commercial areas, (as newspaper



kiosk, bazaar, boutique and entertainment area). Pets are allowed within the above mentioned premises (ref. par. 2 of this agreement) in the maximum number of one per owner only if:

- a. The owner shows the health insurance and vaccination card (compulsory).
 - b. The owner must keep his/her pet on a leash and muzzle or in a cage; for their needs must be taken outside the resort premises and out from the beach making sure to clean them away; it is strictly forbidden within the accommodation area, market and playground;
 - c. Pets cannot be left alone and should not disturb; the resort management reserves the right to dismiss guests and pets in case of breaching these rules.
3. Any exception to part. 1 and 2 of this article should be allowed by the management of the resort. Guide Dogs and Pet-therapy Dogs are allowed and make exceptions to this rule.
4. The owner is responsible for any damage occurred to people or things done by his/her pet. The owner must respect and follow this rule.

10) CLOTHING (supplementing Title III - Chapter I of the Residence Contract)

It is forbidden to go topless within the resort; children are not permitted to enter shops, bars or restaurants in the nude.

11) SWIMMING AND SAILING

The legal provisions in force governing sailing and anchorage within 200 metres of the coast and the use of public and private beaches apply. Lifeguards are obliged to prevent or hinder violations.

12) PLAYGROUNDS (supplementing Title II - Chapters I and II of the Residence Contract)

The playgrounds are reserved for children under 12 years of age. ACCESS FOR ADULTS ONLY WHEN ACCOMPANYING CHILDREN and viceversa; because of weight limits, the equipment must not be used by anyone over 12 years of age. Access with bicycles is forbidden. Violation of these rules entails the expulsion of the person responsible from the playground.

13) ADMISSION PROCEDURES (supplementing Title II - Chapters I and II of the Residence Contract)

- a) ADMISSION: At the times displayed, subject to registration of all admitted persons; all subsequent variations must follow the same procedure. The resort agrees to rent the chosen pitch to the guests at the rates displayed for binding periods as indicated during booking or on the admission form. Pitches must be occupied by a tent, caravan or camper and may be left empty only in the event of delayed arrival of booked guests, and not beyond noon on the first day of delay. The keys of mobile homes are handed over at 5:00 pm.
- b) DAY GUESTS: These are admitted during office opening hours. At the reception, day guests must leave at least one ID security reasons.
- c) VISITS TO THE RESORT: Accompanied by our personnel, unless authorised otherwise by the Reception.
- d) CHOICE OF PITCH: After a visit accompanied by our personnel or as indicated by the Reception Office. At the reception, day guests must leave at least one ID security reasons.
- e) LOCATIONS OF THE PITCHES: Clearly marked with special signs of different colours. As a general rule caravans, campers and tent trailers along the roads, tents behind the caravan pitches.
- f) OCCUPATION OF THE PITCH: Guests must occupy the chosen pitch; authorisation from the Reception Office and a new registration procedure are required to change pitch.
- g) PERIODS OF STAY AND AREAS OF THE CAMPING RESORT: A special area of the camping resort is reserved for stays of less than 7 days that have not been booked in advance.

14) ACCEPTANCE, BOOKING AND STAYS (supplementing Title II - Chapters I, II and III of the Residence Contract)

a) ACCEPTANCE

The resort only accepts families and their guests; parties or groups are not accepted. To preserve the uniformity of the resort, where the vast majority of guests are families, a specific and limited area of the campsite is reserved for young guests who do not form a family and who are not part of a family staying at the resort. Minors are only accepted in the company of an adult who has custody of them. Seasonal contracts are not made; bookings are normally made for a period of at most 28 nights. The booking, even when made at the desk upon arrival, constitutes a free contract between the parties. The Resort Management reserves the right to refuse entry to individuals who in the past have violated the current residence contract or that of previous years and/or who have violated legal regulations, in particular those governing hotels, shops and restaurants. In the period between 01/07 and 31/08, any upward variation of the number of people occupying a pitch must be requested in advance at the Reception and authorised in writing. In the event of expulsion from the resort, this must take place within six hours of the notification by the Resort Management and does not exempt the expelled individual from the payment of the amount owed to the camping resort for accommodation and other services.

b) DEPARTURE: Caravan and tent pitches must be vacated by noon, mobile homes by 10:00 am.

c) EXTENSION OF STAY: Extensions are only possible with the approval of the Reception Office and require the modification of the registration form.

15) LIABILITIES OF THE CAMP & RESORT (supplementing Title IV of the Residence Contract)

The resort does not accept any liability in terms of accommodation rates and/or compensation for damages in the event of temporary power outages, water shortages or technical malfunctions in the systems; it is not liable for any theft of objects (and vehicles in general) or money which may occur in the resort and its accessory areas, and it is liable within the limits of its insurance cover as far as deposited money is concerned. It is not liable for accidents caused by natural elements, such as wind, rain and similar phenomena, by falling branches or pine cones or other plant parts, whether due to weather conditions or not, by the presence of any type of wild animal in the wooded area of the camping resort, animals which are normally present in Mediterranean woods and are considered a part thereof; nor is it liable for accidents caused by the guests or their equipment or vehicles.
